

GREEN WHEEL PETERBOROUGH CAR ASSISTED RIDE SUNDAY 30TH SEPTEMBER 2018

START TIME: 09.30 FROM THE MINERVER BUSINESS PARK: PE2 6FT

The Minerva Business Park is situated about a mile from junction 18 of the A1 at Alwalton. It has a secluded car park at 'The Trail Head' of route 21 just off the A605 see map below.

SUGGESTED TIME FOR LEAVING BEDFORD IS 08.15 GIVEN THE ROAD WORKS ON THE LOWER END OF THE A1.

The Green Wheel at Peterborough is made up of a number of National Cycle Routes located in Peterborough and the surrounding Fen lands. The route below is about 40mils.

The ride starts on the outskirts of Peterborough, on route 21, and cuts through the picturesque Nene Valley Park, on route 63, to travel north on traffic free tracks, quiet country lanes and ancient 'Droves', routes 21 and 12, to the small town of Crowland. Here we take our lunch break at the "Old Paper Shop" coffee house. Good coffee, bacon sandwiches, egg on toast to name just a few delights. We can also take some time to view the unique Trinity Bridge and Crowland's Abbey.

We set off across the A16 on more ancient 'Droves' to Eye Green and pick up Route 21 again on quiet lanes to a wooded track and a short green lane to Flag Fen Archaeology Park. Here we make an afternoon tea stop. Only basic refreshments I'm afraid but a lovely spot to pause in the peace and quiet of the fens.

The final leg of our ride takes us back to Route 63 and along the river Nene, through the town centre, along the side of the Nene Valley Railway to Ferry meadows. Here, if need to, we can take another break at the Lakeside Café before re-joining route 21 to take us back to our cars.
