Springtime bike shows

The Road Cycling Show aims to cover all aspects of road-related cycling and will have information, advice and demonstrations for cyclists into sportives, time trials, road racing, or commuting to work. The Scottish Bike Show is in its second year. It covers road cycling, mountain biking, street trials, BMX and leisure riding and commuting, with stands, have-a-go sessions and displays. CTC will be there too, on stand A10.

Tickets are normally £10 for adults. CTC members get a £1 discount by booking online at thescottishbikeshow.com - just enter 'CTC2012' in the voucher code section.

YORK ON COURSE

THE SAVAGE SKILLS stunt show will be the headline attraction at the 2012 CTC York Cycle Show on 23-24 June. Visitors will also have the chance to try out mountain bikes on site, on a demo track built by local York company Grit Track and Trail. And there will be rides out to York's new dirt jump track at Rawcliffe Country Park, which is next to Sustrans route

Many touring rides will set off from the racecourse site over the weekend, while those looking for a more testing ride can sign up to the Ron Kitching Challenge Ride and Sportive, which starts and finishes at the show (see below).

Events will include displays of Victorian vintage bikes and restored 1980s bikes, plus traditional events such as the saddlebag sale and bike auction.

Entry to the show is £3 for adults and £2 for children aged 5-16, with younger children free and discounts available for families. The show programme will be free, however, as will access to the trade show and exhibition once you're on site.

Bookings are still being accepted for on-site camping, caravan and motorhome pitches (see page 84). For lightweight campers, a wash unit will replace the outmoded tents with their plastic bowls and cold water. The number of portable shower units will also be increased.

For those wishing to pedal into York, the Hub Station by Lendal Bridge offers secure cycle parking for £1 per
