When my copy arrived, I excitedly pored over its pages late into the night planning a potential trip through half remembered mountain-scapes in the Italian Alps. The route descriptions, hand-drawn maps, and photos take by author Fred Wright on his skinny-tyred tourer are inspirational.

Originally a self-published labour of love by Fred, this version is a work of art created by the same publishing house that produced the Rough-Stuff Fellowship archive books - and yet again they've rescued a treasure.

It first came to light in 2002, and incorporates routes that the Rough-Stuff Fellowship's ED Clements circulated in the late 1980s and early '90s. It spans the whole mountain range, and is all the more amazing for when you consider the sparse resources available for research back then. Breaking the Alps down into 16 sections, there are more than 300 route descriptions.

This second edition also features an afterword and Q&A with Fred, giving a little more insight into the how and why behind the book. Combine this guide with modern mapping technology, and you have the catalyst for an adventure of a lifetime. Sam Jones
