

Cycling UK's Step-by-Step Guide to Resolving Issues within a Cycling Group

A safeguarding officer offers advice and guidance for members of the group, as well as helping report and resolve any safeguarding and welfare concerns.

If issues arise where an individual's behaviour causes disruption; for example, by their poor behaviour on a ride, the safeguarding officer should take the following steps:

Step One

If the problem does NOT concern safeguarding issues such as sexual or racial harassment or child protection, please attempt to resolve the issue informally if possible.

Step Two

Discuss the matter confidentially and individually with all parties concerned. Take advice from the group committee where necessary.

Step Three

If the issue cannot be resolved informally, call a committee meeting to discuss it and present a formal response on behalf of the group.

Step Four

If the situation is still not resolved, the issue should be treated as a formal complaint under Cycling UK's Complaints Procedure.
